END THE CAGE AGE CAMPAIGN

Over **300 million farmed animals suffer in cages** across Europe. This is cruel, unnecessary and has no place in Europe. Our campaign seeks to ban cages completely.

In June 2021, the European Commission agreed to phase out the use of cages for farmed animals across the EU. An historic commitment, but the campaign is not over. The meat industry is running on the offensive, trying to extend the transition period and delay the legislative proposal.
